

New Commitments





PIP's portfolio generated £14.9m of distributions1 during the month. This included:

- £2.8m from ECI Partners following the sale of Travel Chapter, an online holiday letting company.
- £2.2m from ECI Partners for the sale of Content+Cloud, an information technology services provider based in the UK.
- £2.1m from Baring Private Equity Asia mainly for the sale of Interplex, a manufacturer of customised product solutions for industrial and medical applications.

PIP made £32.7m of new commitments during the month to two primaries (£27.2m), one secondary (£2.8m) and one co-investment (£2.7m). This included:

- A £15.7m primary commitment to a North American venture fund.
- An £11.5m primary commitment to LYFE Capital Fund IV, an Asian growth equity fund.
- A £2.7m co-investment alongside Altamont Capital Partners in Accelerant, a tech-enabled specialty insurance risk exchange platform based in the USA.
